They fall into three main categories: satellite ground terminals, terrestrial trunk communications systems, and combat net radio systems. Every part of the Army and the uses combat net radio, but only the Royal Corps of Signals and the Royal Air Force operates trunk systems and multi-channel satellite communications.

The heliograph, flags and lamps (all of which are on display at The Museum) played an important communications role, particularly where the army was moving too quickly to establish a telephone network. In 1915 signalling discs and shutters were introduced. These could be operated from cover and read using a periscope.
